Listener opens envelope and unfolds the letter.

Photo Bonnie suddenly became a little nervous. Her sister Bev shows her a

photograph of the vaccination hub they are going to visit as it is not her

normal doctors' surgery.

Show photograph of vaccination hub

Mask, On Thursday, Bev collects Bonnie in her car. Bev is wearing her mask and

etc Bonnie is wearing a face shield.

Show mask, shield or lanyard

Hand Bev pushes Bonnie into the vaccination centre.

Sanitiser "Good morning," said a lovely volunteer, "can you please sanitise your

hands and the handles of your wheelchair?"

Wash and sanitise hands

Action Bev helps Bonnie to answer a few guestions.

Page Discuss questions asked and answers required – different for each individual

Action The nurse asked Bonnie to take off her cardigan.

Page "Would you like the jab in your right arm or your left arm?"

Point to listener's right and left arm

No page "All done" said the nurse.

"Wow, that didn't hurt at all" said Bonnie.

Vaccinati The Nurse gives Bonnie a special card that she must look after to confirm

on card that she has had the vaccination.

Hand vaccination card to listener

Timer Bonnie and Bev sit in the waiting area for 15 minutes before they can

leave.

Set a timer for 15 minutes – timing adjustable to type of vaccination given

Please turn over.

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Bonnie and Bev arrive back home.

Calendar "That was easy" said Bonnie. "You did really well" replied Bev.

Together they put the date on the calendar for the second jab.

Use a calendar to write/type 'second jab'

Tea and They both enjoy a cup of tea, a biccie and look forward to safer times

biscuit ahead.

Hold cup and eat biscuit - adaptable to each individual.

**Pre-story preparations:** Fold up paper and place in envelope, print photograph of your local vaccination hub and blank vaccination card.

#### Items required for story:

- Letter/ Envelope (other communication method like using a phone or receiving a text work too)
- Vaccine centre photograph
- Mask/ face shield/ exemption lanyard
- Hand sanitiser
- Vaccination card
- Timer (kitchen timer, or one on a phone)
- Calendar (physical, or one on a phone)
- Cup and biscuit if appropriate

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
