Main purposes of the post

- To visit venues such as special schools, libraries, adult day centres and care homes throughout the South West to a mutually agreed timetable.
- To tell multi-sensory stories to children and adults with severe learning disabilities.
- To train venue staff in multi-sensory storytelling and to act as a mentor to those staff as they learn.

Position within the organisation

Report to:Storytelling Manager.Other Key Relationships:Storytelling-Training Co-ordinator, trainees, other venue staff.

Duties and key responsibilities

- To attend training sessions in multi-sensory storytelling.
- To visit venues throughout the South West arranged by the Storytelling-Training Co-ordinator.
- To run a number of 45 minute multi-sensory storytelling sessions throughout the day to groups of 4-8 people with severe or profound & multiple learning disabilities and/or severe autism spectrum disorder.
- To train venue staff in multi-sensory storytelling and to enable them to match stories to their listeners in regard to age appropriateness and likely level of attention skills.
- If required, to act as a mentor to venue staff until they are able to confidently deliver multi-sensory stories effectively and safely to children, young people and adults with a range of challenging behaviours.
- To maintain full and accurate records of the sessions, and to forward them to Bag Books in a timely and systematic manner.
- To promote multi-sensory storytelling and Bag Books.

General Responsibilities

- To agree and adhere to the Bag Books Staff Handbook and all Policies and Procedures, including Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults Policy and Health and Safety Policy.
- To undertake any other reasonable duties as required, from time to time, by the Storytelling Manager.
